FREE LUTHERAN SEMINARY

FLS is a graduate school of theology with a focus on training future pastors and Christian leaders. FLS trains men who perceive God’s call to service in a local congregation, the mission field, or other areas of pastoral ministry. FLS offers a Master of Divinity (M.Div.) degree in a three-year classroom format and one-year internship.
