

Strategic Plan 2023 – 2026

Core Purpose

The Free Lutheran Bible College was founded in 1966 to see God transform young people through the teaching of His Word. It was of primary concern among the founders of the AFLC to establish young Christians in the Word of God before college and help believers be equipped for life and ministry in local congregations and communities.

The Free Lutheran Seminary was founded in 1964 to train men to be servant pastors in the AFLC. The founders of the AFLC wanted pastors trained to handle the infallible and inerrant Word of God with respect and care, and to minister to their congregations with love and attentiveness, understanding the congregation as the right form of the kingdom of God on earth.

Three Year Strategic Narrative

At graduation 2026, leaders share about the state of the school with parents and financial partners. They report that enrollment has surpassed 160 thanks in part to the new AA and BA in Bible and Ministry. Both have outperformed expectations. They share the good news that for a second year in a row the school has operated with a balanced budget, and they announce that the total endowment of FLBCS has passed \$10 million. Other leaders from the AFLC share stories of how FLBCS students are impacting congregations across the denomination. Student leaders give passioned talks about how the school has prepared them for life and ministry because of its unwavering theological stance and the school culture that is standing firm in the face of increased pressure and hostility from the world. Finally, the presentation concludes by announcing that as a result of its financial strength, vision and unequivocal commitment to its values, donors are giving more, students are enrolling more and AFLC congregations are flourishing.
